

Communiqué

Meeting of the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia held on 24 November 2016 at the AHPRA South Australia office, Adelaide.

The Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (the National Board or NMBA) is the national regulator for nursing and midwifery in Australia. It is established under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law, as in force in each state and territory (the National Law).

The NMBA meets monthly and considers a range of matters, the most important of which are published in this Communiqué.

NMBA Code of conduct consultation opens in January 2017 for nurses, midwives and the public

The NMBA has reviewed its codes of conduct for nurses and midwives and will open a public consultation on the draft codes in January 2017.

The draft codes are research-based and have been through extensive consultation with the professions and other stakeholders. The development of the draft codes included:

- literature and evidence reviews.
- analysis of notification data on conduct, behaviour and boundaries for nurses and midwives to ensure contemporary conduct issues are captured in the codes,
- · input from key stakeholder working groups, and
- focus group sessions held in metropolitan, rural and regional locations across Australia.

Every nurse and midwife in Australia will receive an invitation to have their say on the draft *Code of conduct* for their profession. The consultation survey will be available to the public on the NMBA website.
